Miracle Theatre has been touring original, inventive theatre across the UK since 1979, with much of that time spent in the South West. Producing a rich mix of touring theatre from new writing to popular adaptations of classic plays.

Unfortunately, the pandemic resulted in having to cancel a summer tour for the first time since 1988 and, like most of the theatre industry, Miracle were left waiting in the wings for the moment to re-emerge. During 2020, many of their past shows have been aired on their YouTube channel and with other partners. Alongside that, they have hosted 'Play at Home' online drama workshops for families and young people, 'Building Community' workshops to bring together Exeter University staff and students who have been working remotely and have been busily planning exciting future projects.

Miracle are incredibly thankful to have received funding through the Government's Cultural Recovery Fund twice in order to be able to get back out on the road in 2021. This year they are touring a new show written by Bill Scott called *Star crazy*, a cosmic comedy about obsession and the rekindling of love, hope and possibility, which will, of course, be touring to Maizey Lodge.

While the impact of Covid will continue to effect Miracle for a long time to come, they have big plans for the next year of shows and any donations are incredibly vital to the success of these plans, and the development of the work they do with young people and communities.
