




Community walk for our footpaths

History Group Update

More effort has been made in putting together the history of the Silks (formerly the Wheatsheaf) and understanding the rather involved land exchanges over the last 170 years. We now have a reasonably complete list of owners and licensees up to the 1970s but we are having some difficulty in filling in the more recent details.

As a spin-off from this research we have a much clearer idea of the activities carried out in the village – two bakeries, at least five forges, two carpenters (or a change of venue for one), a rare chicken breeds specialist (with prizes not only for the birds but also the size of their eggs!) and a snippet from the Marlborough Times of 1877:

Fire and Mayhem in Ogbourne St Andrew

The danger of fire in thatched buildings has been noted before, but between 9 and 10 o'clock at night on Friday April 6th 1877 a chain of events occurred which ended in a fight in St Andrew. A Mrs Draper, whilst going to bed, knocked over an oil lamp which set fire to a screen, bed furniture and then the thatch on her cottage. Her children were led to safety, but the fire spread next door to Sawyer's cottage. An invalid, he was carried out to the adjacent Vicarage. The fire was by now quite serious, setting light to some outhouses and stores of oats.

Someone ran to Marlborough and rang the alarm, a bell on the Town Hall. The fire brigade readied the horse-drawn engine and then waited for half an hour. Apparently, they couldn't move without authority from a 'responsible' official. A crowd in the town apparently voiced their concern, but until the Town Cleric [sic] had visited the fire and sent back suitable instructions, the fire brigade didn't move!

On arriving at Ogbourne they were met with 'yells of execration and shouts of derision' and some were assaulted! Fights broke out and one fireman was 'savagely bitten on the throat'.

Apparently, the cottages were insured by their owner, but it is doubtful if the Drapers or Sawyer would have had any cover. It is not certain which cottages were involved, but they must have been close to the Vicarage (now Tresco House).

Recycling: sort before you bring to the tip

Wiltshire Council data shows that more than a third of the items put in the general rubbish skips at its household recycling centres (HRCs) could have been recycled. So please sort your waste before you visit so that it can be recycled.

Some of the items you can recycle at the Marlborough HRC include:

- textiles and clothing
- plastics
- paper
- wood

- metals, cans and aerosols
- electrical items
- cardboard
- soil and rubble

So, whether you have been clearing out the garage, moving house, or just having a tidy up, please take the time and care to sort out your recycling before you visit the tip.

Kerbside collection for small rechargeables

You can also now recycle small rechargeable electrical items as part of your fortnightly kerbside collection service. These include:

- MP3 players
- electric toothbrushes
- shavers/trimmers
- all vapes and e-cigarettes
- wireless earphones

- smart watches
- mobile phones
- digital cameras
- charging devices/power banks

All you need to do is place these items in a carrier bag next to your blue-lidded bin. Note that any mains-powered electrical item that needs to be plugged in to work, or individual rechargeable items larger than a shoe box, still need to be taken to the HRC (tip).

You can also put out small household batteries in a sealed clear sandwich bag (please store batteries until you have enough to fill the bag, making sure it can be securely closed). Place on top of your blue-lidded bin or beside your blue recycling sack so that the collection crew can see them, and never in the bin.
